INVOLVE**MENT**

A mental health cohort for adolescents – Project plan

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Background

Adolescents (As) in Norway: 15-20 % have reduced function due to mental health problems, 8 % have been diagnosed. All patients have the legal right to be actively involved in their own healthcare treatment as well as at system level (for improving healthcare services).

Aims

To assess user involvement at individual and system level in primary and secondary health care services for adolescents with mental health problems/conditions, and to assess their satisfaction with, and effectiveness, cost-effectiveness and safety of healthcare services.

Methods

Recruit a population cohort (age 13 – 17, N: max.30,000). A range of interventions TwiCs & qualitative studies.

Ethical concerns - TwiCs specific

<u>Cohort</u>: Information & consent Aim: Learn about As' mental health

Data for assessing effectiveness of interventions

Consent process: What are we asking for and what information is given?

RCT: Information & consent

Information about random selection to intervention group only.

Disappointment: As sharing information over the internet / social media?

Ethical concerns - Generic

Voluntary participation
Right to withdraw
Confidentiality with limitations
Age appropriate information
Informed consent: 13-15 A + parent, 16+ alone
